"Ready to Vote" Marks LWVCV's First Event in Alexander County

The #UniteNC "Ready To Vote" presentation by Common Cause North Carolina, co-powered by LWVCV, at the Alexander County Senior Center on January 18, 2024 was well-attended and well-received—despite the cold weather that night.

Alexander County Board of Elections Director Patrick Wike was there to answer questions and provide input as well. The timely information-packed presentation explained changes in voter registration, voting and elections for 2024. Based on the train-the-trainer model and with the intent of spreading the message, attendees were provided with the presentation to download and handouts to share with others.

This was the first ever LWVCV-sponsored event in Alexander County. It was an excellent start to the League's collaboration with the Alexander Board of Elections. More photos from the event are on the League website <u>here</u>.

As we enter 2024, the LWVCV Nominating Committee is seeking to identify and nominate potential individuals for officers. We need you now more than ever! While it is the Nominating Committee's responsibility for ensuring a qualified slate of officers for each position, we need you as members to help identify nominees for the future of the organization. Please, take time to consider who you believe has the qualities and skills to best lead our organization, including yourself! If you know of someone who is not ready for nomination for 2024 but wants the Nominating Committee to follow up for future consideration, please let the Nominating Committee Chair know.

The Nominating Committee welcomes nominations or self-nominations for the following positions. Candidates must be current League members in good standing. Any current member may nominate a fellow member or may self-nominate.

Two Year Term of Service:

- **President:** Serves as the spokesperson, promoting the League and its initiatives and activities.
- **Secretary:** Keeps effective communications to inform Executive Board members, officers, and League members.

One Year Term of Service:

• **Treasurer** (Completing the second year of an incomplete term, June 2024-May 2025) Organizes, documents and records of the League's financial activities.

- **Nominating Chair:** Coordinates with Committee members to identify, interview and present a slate of the best candidates for the open officer positions before the annual meeting.
- **Nominating Committee Member:** Collaborates with the Nominating Committee members to develop a slate of officers prior to the annual meeting.



Learn What You Need to Know for Primary Season 2024

NC voters have choices many choices to make as we elect officials in 2024. <u>Some</u> of these races will hold a primary to narrow the field of candidates for the November general election. Our primary election day is **Tuesday, March 5, 2024.**

Most of our races this cycle are partisan. That means that candidates file by one of our state's 5 recognized political parties (Democratic, Green, Libertarian, No Labels and Republican). Primary voters affiliated with any political party will be given a ballot of candidates for their party. Unaffiliated voters can choose to vote in either the Democratic, Libertarian or Republican primary. (The Green and No Labels parties did not submit candidates for the primary, but each may nominate candidates for the November general election.)



A different timeline for voting, a new batch of candidates, expanded voter ID laws and redrawn voting district lines are all part of this election. Be informed! The LWVCV website has pages for these topics:

LWVCV Charges Up at *Power the South* Event



LWVUS' Power the South: North Carolina was held in Greensboro on January 26-27, 2024. Two LWVCV Board members, Linda Greenwell and Betty Lohr, and LWVCV President and LWVNC Board Member Tiffany Canaday were in attendance. Presentations included: "Strengthening Our People-Powered Movement," focused on volunteer engagement; "Get-Out-The-Vote (GOTV)," advancing a comprehensive voter contact strategy; "Proactive Practices and Tactics to Combat Mis/Disinformation"; "Membership Recruitment & Leadership Development"; "Leveraging Litigation"; and a SWOT Analysis Activity to help Leagues overcome challenges.

The engaging and informative presentations were delivered by LWVUS staff and LWVNC President Jennifer Rubin. LWVCV attendees left the conferences invigorated with fresh ideas and possibilities for LWVCV. LWVCV Board member Linda Greenwell said, "This was a great opportunity to meet and interact with three groups - national staff, state officers and local chapter members. Getting ideas from three perspectives was very helpful and, hopefully, our group will benefit from what we learned at the sessions."

Power the South (PTS) is a campaign for Leagues, alongside regional and local partners, to strengthen our people-powered organizing as an antidote against the rising systemic threats to our democracy, such as white supremacy, patriarchy, classism and authoritarianism.
